Consultancy to support development of (i) a monitoring and evaluation system for tracking the implementation of the National strategy on older persons and (ii) guideline on social work in providing care and rehabilitation for older persons

Purpose of	Background					
consultancy:	Viet Nam is undergoing a period of rapid population ageing. Available projections indicate a swift transition from an "ageing" society in 2011 to an "aged" one by 2036 when the proportion of people aged 60 and over will reach 20% of the total population. In addition, Viet Nam's "demographic dividend" was also projected to end by 2039. This transition poses both opportunities and challenges to the social protection system, healthcare, long-term care, and the development of an age-friendly living environment.					
	To pro-actively adapt to this demographic transition, the Government of Viet Nam has issued strategic documents, including the Decision No. 383/QD-TTg dated March 20 <sup>th</sup> , 2025, approving the "National strategy on older persons (OP) to 2035, with a vision to 2045" (strategy). The Strategy emphasizes the need to build a society that adapts to the rapid population ageing context, ensuring that OP receive comprehensive care, live healthy and active lives with dignity, and participate fully in socio-economic activities.  The new National Strategy on Older Persons is a major national policy intervention requiring the coordination of multiple ministries and all localities. For the first time, the Government has tasked the Social Protection Administration (SPA) to develop the Monitoring and Evaluation (M&E) system to track the strategy's implementation. Due to limited technical capacity and without additional funding from the government for external expert support in developing M&E indicators and SOPs that are SMART, link to the Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs), integrate real-time data from other ministries and localities nationwide, and leverage information technology, the SPA has requested UNFPA to provide technical support to produce/contribute to::  - A unified and comprehensive set of monitoring indicators to measure the progress					
	<ul> <li>and results of the Strategy's implementation nationwide.</li> <li>A results-based and real-time reporting system to overcome the limitations of the current system, which is fragmented, primarily based on periodic local paper-based reports, and a lack of automation and real-time capabilities.</li> </ul>					
	<ul> <li>An information technology (IT) system to create a centralized database for monitoring the indicators related to OP.</li> </ul>					
	- Early warning tools to promptly detect shortcomings and risks during implementation, especially at the local level.					
	In addition to the need for UNFPA support in improving the M&E system to monitor the implementation of the National Strategy on OP, SPA also requested UNFPA support in developing the guideline on social work in providing care and rehabilitation for OP. Although social work has been developing in Viet Nam for over 25 years (since 2010), there are still no official guidelines on social work for providing comprehensive care for OP. This consultant team will also work closely with SPA officials to ensure the guidelines address the multifaceted needs of OP, encompassing physical, mental health, and social well-being as well as navigate the complexities and dynamics of population ageing, access necessary services, and maintain their dignity and active independence. This includes understanding the specific needs of older people with disabilities and older people from LGBTQI+ and ethnic minority communities. Therefore, UNFPA will bring an integrated					

approach to support OP moving away from the 'silo'' approach which tends to be applied by SPA.

Without UNFPA support, there is a substantial risk that the resulting M&E framework, SOP and guidelines on social work in providing comprehensive care for OP will be inadequate—failing to be comprehensive, evidence-based, aligned with SMART principles, SDGs and technology-enabled. To mitigate this risk, technical assistance from UNFPA is essential.

Therefore, the Social Protection Administration (SPA), Ministry of Health proposed UNFPA to initiate consultancy support to develop (i) a monitoring and evaluation system for tracking the implementation of the National strategy on OP and (ii) guidelines on social work in providing care and rehabilitation for OP.

### **Purpose of the consultancy**

A team of three consultants will be hired to assist the SPA:

- 1. To develop a set of scientific, integrated, technology-enabled and SMART indicators and a reporting system to monitor the implementation of the national strategy on older persons at both central and local levels. This system will be designed to enhance the effectiveness of state management, strengthen accountability, and provide a robust evidence base for the timely adjustment of policies and programs on supporting OP, and contributing to improvement of M&E tasks of the strategy implementation.
- 2. Leveraging the results of the above objective, to develop a set of professional guidelines on social work for providing the comprehensive care and rehabilitation of OP. The guidelines aim to standardize the procedures for care and rehabilitation for OP, thus contributing to enhancing professional capacity and practical skills of social workers, and thereby improving the quality of support services to meet the individual needs of OP and facilitating effective adaptation to Viet Nam's rapid population ageing.

## Scope of work:

(Description of services, activities, or outputs)

Working under the overall guidance and stewardship of the UNFPA Representative and the Population & Development Team Leader, the direct supervision and coordination of the Program Analyst on Inclusive Growth & Social Protection, and the focal point officer from SPA/MOH, the selected consultants are requested to fulfil the purpose of this consultancy by completing - *but not limited to*, the following tasks and expected outputs:

#### I. Expected outputs:

- 1. A technical proposal for the consultancy implementation;
- 2. UNFPA technical recommendations and stakeholder consultation results incorporated and highlighted in the draft log-framework and set of SMART indicators for monitoring the strategy implementation;
- 3. UNFPA recommendations and stakeholder consultation results incorporated and highlighted in the draft reporting forms and SOP for monitoring and reporting on the strategy implementation;
- 4. UNFPA technical recommendations and stakeholder consultation results with clear outcomes, outputs, timeframe, responsibilities among different stakeholders, monitoring mechanism and resource plan, incorporated and highlighted in the draft road-map for implementation of the monitoring and reporting system on the strategy implementation;
- 5. UNFPA technical recommendations and stakeholder consultation results incorporated and highlighted in the draft guidelines on social work in providing care and rehabilitation for OP.
- 6. UNFPA technical recommendations and stakeholder consultation results incorporated and highlighted in the *final drafts* of (i) Log-framework and Set of indicators for monitoring the strategy implementation; (ii) Reporting forms and SOP

for monitoring and reporting on the strategy implementation; (iii) Road-map for implementation of the monitoring and reporting system on the strategy implementation and (iv) Guideline on Social Work for Care and Rehabilitation of OP.

#### II. Tasks

# Task 1: Desk review of existing documents and development of technical proposal for the consultancy implementation.

- Conduct consultations with representatives from the line ministries (Ministry of Health, Ministry of Finance, Vietnam Association of the Elderly, etc.), development partners, NGOs, at least three provinces/cities representing different geographical regions, three social organizations, and three independent experts. The consultation can be conducted both in-person and virtually by telephone, or via zoom subjective to the arrangement for most convenience and effectiveness.
- Document needs, feedback, and current M&E practices to ensure the designed set of indicators are scientific, integrated, IT-applicable, SMART nationwide.
- Conduct a desk review of existing reports and documents, for *(but not limited to)*:
- Developing the M&E system of the National Strategy's implementation: The Decision No. 383/QD-TTg, Decision No. 2156/QD-TTg, Decision 1579/QD-TTg, the Law on the Elderly, the Law on Statistics, Decree 20/2021/ND-CP, Decree 76/2024/ND-CP, and Decree 176/2025/ND-CP; and
- Developing guideline on social work for OP: such as Decree No. 110/2024/ND-CP on social work; Decision No. 112/QD-TTg on the social work development program for 2021-2030; Circular No. 02/2023/TT-BLDTBXH; and the draft Master plan on development and improvement of community-based health care worker network and health care facilities for OP to 2030 with a vision to 2045; the 10-year review report of Law on the Elderly; the report on the survey of needs of OP and policy recommendations for adapting to rapid population ageing in Vietnam, and the policy paper: applying foresight for curating a care economy for OP in Vietnam, and other related documents.
- Analyze, synthesize, and develop a technical proposal to carry out this consultancy, including the objectives, methodologies, key outputs, timeline, detailed tasks to be performed, stakeholders for consultation, and a report outline.
- Propose key M&E indicators that are integrated, IT-applicable, and SMART on a national scale.
- Leverage the results of developing a set of SMART monitoring indicators and a reporting system to propose the main contents for the guideline on social work in assistance, care for and rehabilitation for OP.
- Discuss/consult with the SPA/MOH and UNFPA (the Population & Development team/PD to reach a consensus on the technical proposal for the consultancy implementation before implementation.

**Output 1:** Technical proposal for the consultancy implementation.

# <u>Task 2: Consultation and development of a log-framework and SMART indicators for</u> monitoring the strategy's implementation

• Based on consultation results, propose solutions and provide technical support to SPA in developing a logical framework for tracking the Strategy implementation,

- including stratifying objective levels (strategic goals, specific objectives, outcomes, activities).
- Provide technical support to SPA to develop a set of SMART monitoring indicators to track the strategy implementation, including input, output, outcome, and impact indicators, disaggregated by gender, geographical area, and vulnerable groups.
- Link the monitoring indicators with national statistical targets, relevant SDGs, and current reporting needs.
- Prepare presentation(s) and present the draft log-framework and set of indicators at technical meetings/consultation workshops to gather multi-dimensional feedback and comments from the related stakeholders.

**Output 2:** UNFPA technical recommendations and stakeholder consultation results incorporated and highlighted in the draft log-framework and set of SMART indicators for monitoring the strategy implementation.

# <u>Task 3: Consultation and development of reporting forms and Standard Operating Procedures (SOP)</u>

- Based on the draft log- framework and SMART monitoring indicators (Output 2), the consultant team will consult with the related stakeholder and provide technical support for SPA to:
  - Develop the reporting forms (both paper based and electronic/web-based versions) on the strategy implementation, including guidelines for data recording and field data collection procedures.
  - Design the structure for a centralized database for real-time data aggregation and analysis.
  - Develop the Standard Operating Procedures (SOP) for operational, maintenance, and updating the collected data monitoring and reporting on the strategy implementation.
- Prepare presentation(s) and present the draft reporting system and SOP at technical meetings/consultation workshops to gather multi-dimensional feedback and comments from the related stakeholders.

**Output 3:** UNFPA recommendations and stakeholder consultation results incorporated and highlighted in the draft reporting forms and SOP for monitoring and reporting on the strategy implementation.

# <u>Task 4: Technical support for developing the road-map for implementing the monitoring and reporting system</u>

- Based on the drafts of Outputs 2 and 3, the consultant team will conduct review and consultations with SPA, VNPA, VAE and UNFPA and to develop a roadmap/plan for the nationwide implementation of the monitoring and reporting system.
- Propose different design options for operating the monitoring and reporting system both online and offline. The online is preferred: Promote and utilize IT based monitoring & reporting forms to feed data into a centralized, real-time database for immediate aggregation and analysis. While the offline options are alternative: Use standardized paper-based monitoring & reporting forms for field data collection, followed by manual entry into the central system.
- Propose necessary infrastructure required for operating the system, including a centralized server or cloud hosting for the database and IT application. Users at all levels require internet-connected devices (computers, tablets) to access

- digital/web-based forms, enabling real-time data collection, aggregation and analysis, etc.
- Propose a brief guideline on operational & maintenance (O&M) of the system, required trainings and technical support for operating M&E system at national level.
- Prepare presentation(s) and present the proposed roadmap at technical meetings/consultation workshops to gather multi-dimensional feedback and comments from the related stakeholders.

**Output 4:** UNFPA technical recommendations and stakeholder consultation results with clear outcomes, outputs, timeframe, responsibilities among different stakeholders, monitoring mechanism and resource plan, incorporated and highlighted in the draft roadmap for implementation of the monitoring and reporting system on the strategy implementation.

# <u>Task 5: Consultation with the related stakeholders and development of guidelines on social work for the comprehensive care and rehabilitation of OP</u>

- The consultant team is required to consult with related stakeholders and propose key contents for the guidelines, focusing on *(but not limited to)*:
  - Specific guidance on social work professional practice steps (e.g., beneficiary identification, referrals, counselling, vocational guidance, service connection, implementation planning), roles and responsibilities of key stakeholders, and expected outcomes.
  - Specific guidance on governance/coordination/communication/counselling mechanisms among parties to ensure the quality of interventions in a comprehensive and synchronous manner.
  - Specific guidance on case management plans and follow-up after interventions end.
  - Key risks and mitigation measures.
- Prepare presentation(s) and present the proposed roadmap at technical meetings/consultation workshops to gather multi-dimensional feedback and comments from the related stakeholders.

**Output 5:** UNFPA technical recommendations and stakeholder consultation results incorporated and highlighted in the draft guidelines on social work in providing care and rehabilitation for OP.

#### Task 6: Consolidation of comments and finalization of the outputs

- Present Outputs 2, 3, 4, and 5 for consultation with stakeholders in at least two technical meetings/workshops to be organized by UNFPA and SPA.
- Finalize all consultancy outputs based on feedback, comments, suggestions and recommendations from the related stakeholders.

**Output 6:** Final drafts with UNFPA technical recommendations and stakeholder consultation results incorporated and highlighted in the (i) Log-framework and Set of indicators for monitoring the strategy implementation; (ii) Reporting forms and SOP for monitoring and reporting on the strategy implementation; (iii) Road-map for implementation of the monitoring and reporting system on the strategy implementation and (iv) Guideline on Social Work for Care and Rehabilitation of OP.
