Project Title	“Improving the Quality of Life of Persons with Disabilities in Provinces Sprayed with Agent Orange” (Inclusion 2b Project)

1. BACKGROUND

CRS is an international non-governmental organization that has been operating in Vietnam since 1994. Through cooperation with the government and communities, CRS implements projects in 10 provinces/cities in Vietnam. The CRS Vietnam Program receives diverse funding in the areas of Disability, Disaster and Mine Risk Reduction, and Community-Based Climate Change Adaptation. The Disability Program focuses on supporting persons with disabilities (PWDs) in developing support models, promoting inclusive education, and strengthening the capacity of organizations of PWDs as well as associations of parents of children with disabilities.

CRS is currently implementing the project “Improving the Quality of Life of PWDs in Provinces Heavily Sprayed with Agent Orange” in Gia Lai and Quang Ngai Provinces (Inclusion II-b Project). The project is funded by the U.S. Department of State. The National Action Center for Chemical and Environmental Remediation (NACCET) serves as the project owner. HI is the project management agency, and CRS is responsible for implementing Objective 2, focusing on supporting home-based care models for persons with disabilities, pre-discharge care for patients with disabilities, and psychological and social support for PWDs and their families.

According to the 2026 project plan, the project will develop 20 videos on care for persons with mental/neurological disabilities, PWDs who have swallowing/eating difficulties, and PWDs who are bedridden long-term and at risk of secondary complications. To effectively implement this activity, CRS seeks an expert team with experience in producing medical videos using AI technology. The scope of work is detailed below.

2. OBJECTIVES

To produce 20 finalized AI-generated videos based on the provided medical scripts, in order to provide guidance on basic caregiving skills at home and in healthcare facilities, reduce the burden on caregivers, and improve the quality of life of PWDs.

3. SCOPE OF WORK: Develop 20 complete videos using AI technology in accordance with Ministry of Health regulations, incorporating feedback from and approval by the appraisal panel.

- Receiving 20 detailed scripts from the project's medical expert team, collaborating with key technical personnel to develop the technical execution criteria for the final outputs.
- Writing AI scripts based on the technical procedures provided by the expert team.
- Using AI tools and software (image generation, video generation, AI voice generation) to transform the scripts into 20 complete videos.
- Coordinate with a sign-language expert to develop narration and sign-language illustration within the AI videos.
- Ensuring that AI-generated characters accurately simulate biomechanical movements in accordance with guidance from the medical expert team.
- Ensuring that the final products (including AI-generated images and audio) do not violate commercial copyright and comply with CRS communication principles. All AI tools/software used must be legally compliant.

4. CONTENT

4.1 Instruction videos content:

1	Duration	3–7 minutes/video
2	Resolution & File Format	- Minimum resolution: 1920 x 1080 pixels (Full HD). - File format: MP4. - Compatible for multi-platform use (YouTube, website, Facebook) and easy sharing in online groups and forums.
3	Lighting & Sound	- Lighting must allow viewers to clearly observe all content, not too bright and not too dark. - Sound must be clear without echo or reverberation.
4	Language	- Vietnamese voice-over. - Sign language. - Use common language, minimizing specialized technical terminology as much as possible.
5	Methods of Content Presentation	- Skills demonstrated by realistic AI-generated avatar characters. - One avatar will demonstrate sign language. - Use text/subtitles to summarize key points and use illustrations/motion graphics to support explanation. - Graphics must reflect local context and be culturally appropriate.
6	Content Delivery	Each video provides guidance on one specific skill. Each video must be accompanied by a written skill guidance document, concise, easy to read and understand, including: - Purpose of the skills

		- Target audience - Required preparation - Step-by-step instructions - Key notes - 3 multiple-choice questions for knowledge assessment.
7	Key Messages and Knowledge	- Use keywords and/or subtitles. - Graphics should reflect local context. - Each video must end with a summary section using narration combined with images and text to emphasize key messages. - Clearly display the logos of funding agencies, participating organizations, and the production team.

- Experience working with communities, especially PWDs and ethnic minority groups, is an advantage.
- Strong teamwork and interpersonal communication skills; good observation, overview, and assessment capacity.

Interested candidates/organizations are requested to submit proposals **in English or Vietnamese**.

The application package includes:

- A brief technical proposal, including a summary of methodology, proposed AI tools/software, and video production approach.

- Organizational profile, including links to AI video products previously developed.
- Proposed work plan.
- Curriculum Vitae (CV) demonstrating relevant qualifications and experience.
- Financial proposal specifying daily rates in Vietnamese Dong (VND), inclusive of applicable taxes (VAT/PIT).
